#### Recipe to share ....

#### **GAIL'S POTATO SOUP**

- 1 bag of frozen simply potatoes, hash brown variety
- One carton of low sodium chicken broth
- \* 1 finely chopped medium sweet onion
- 1 can cream of chicken soup, one can of cream of celery soup. Dilute with 1 can cream or milk
- \* 1 block of cream cheese
- \* 4 oz butter
- \* shredded cheddar cheese
- \* 1 teaspoon chopped garlic
- \* scallions

Add the first 3 ingredients and bring to a boil. After onion is cooked and potatoes are soft, add cream of celery and cream of chicken soup, diluted with one can of milk or cream. Blend in unsalted butter and finely chopped garlic. Remove from heat after well blended. Melt in this mixture the cream cheese. Serve with shredded cheddar cheese and chopped scallions.
