

This recipe makes the best ginger cookies I have ever eaten. The recipe is one I got from Carolyn Roof nearly 20 years ago. It's worth the effort.

2 1/4 all purpose flour

- 1 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon all spice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon black ground pepper
- 1 1/2 sticks unsalted butter room temp
- 1/2 cup white sugar plus more for rolling cookies
- 1/4 cup light brown sugar
- 1 large egg yolk room temp
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 2 tablespoons apricot or ginger preserves

Mix flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, allspice, mustard, salt, pepper in a bowl.

Beat sugars with butter, and add the egg yolk and vanilla. Add molasses and preserves. Beat and add in dry ingredients to make a soft dough. Mix and cover. Freeze 20 minutes. Scoop portion of dough and roll into balls Roll in white sugar. Place on cookie sheets, sprayed with non stick cooking spray. Bake 10-12 minutes at 375*. Cool on a rack.

A lot of ingredients! Carolyn and I and our spouses along with Bill and Carol Baugh visited Magnolia Manor one Christmas. She made these for us to eat on the way. I could not get enough of them!!!
