# Dijon Chicken Asparagus Roll Ups

3 tablespoons Dijon mustard 1/2 cup low fat mayonnaise 1 lemon, juiced (approximately 3 tablespoons)

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Grease an 11-by-7-inch baking dish. In a bowl,

mix together the mustard, mayonnaise,

lemon juice, thyme, salt and pepper; set

aside. Place asparagus in a microwave

safe dish and microwave on high

1-11/2 minutes. Place chicken breasts

between two sheets of heavy plastic

(a re-sealable freezer bag works well)

on a firm surface. Pound the chicken breasts with the smooth side of a meat

mallet to thickness of ¼ inch. Place

one slice of cheese and four asparagus

spears on each breast. Tightly roll the

chicken breasts around the asparagus

2 teaspoons black pepper 1/2 teaspoon salt 16 spears fresh asparagus, trimmed

2 teaspoons dried thyme 4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves (about 5 ounces each) 4 slices skimmed mozzarella cheese 1 cup panko bread crumbs

> and cheese. Place each, seam side down, in the prepared baking dish. Apply a coating of the mustard mixture to each chicken breast and sprinkle each with the panko crumbs, pressing the crumbs into the chicken to secure. Bake 35 minutes or until the chicken temperature is 165 degrees F. For crisper chicken, place roll-ups under the broiler for 1-2 minutes on high. Yield: 4 servings
